 - ethical reasoning: assessed via plagiarism tutorial and some course eval questions

4. Handling Oral Communication

A proposal by Dr. Cummings and the Department of Writing and Rhetoric was discussed. The Committee was in general support of the suggestions to a) expand the number of Spch 102/105 sections and to possibly create an online version of Spch 102, b) to create a one-hour course, possibly having an online component, focusing on speech in the electronic format, to provide as an option to satisfy the oral communication requirement for students, and c) to hire a coordinator for the above.

5. Consideration of adding information literacy and/or modifying ethical reasoning/responsibility

This was discussed, with no specific action.
